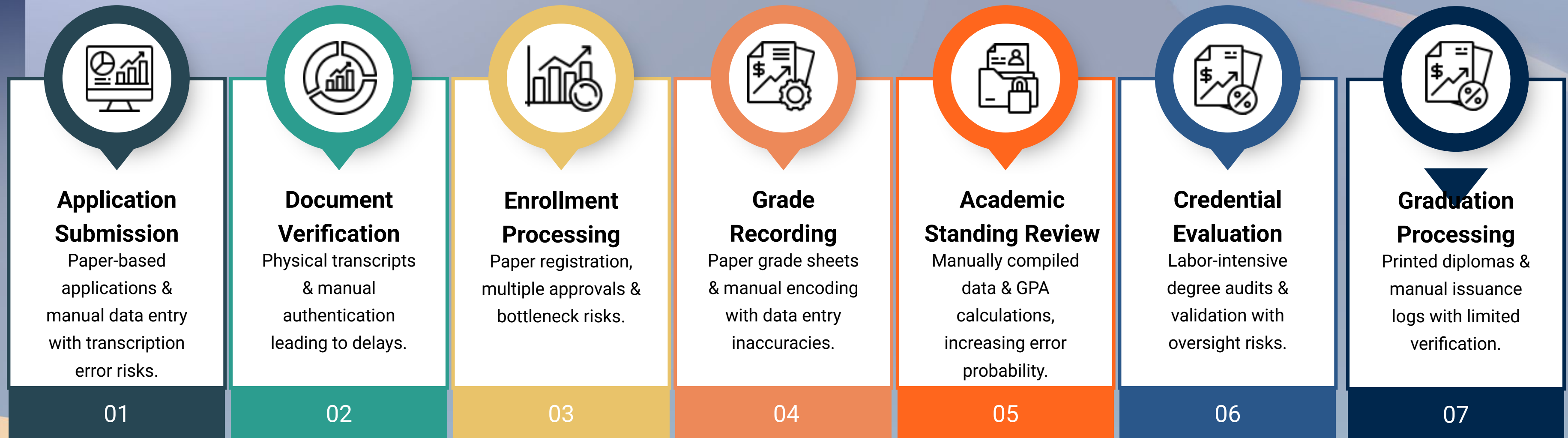

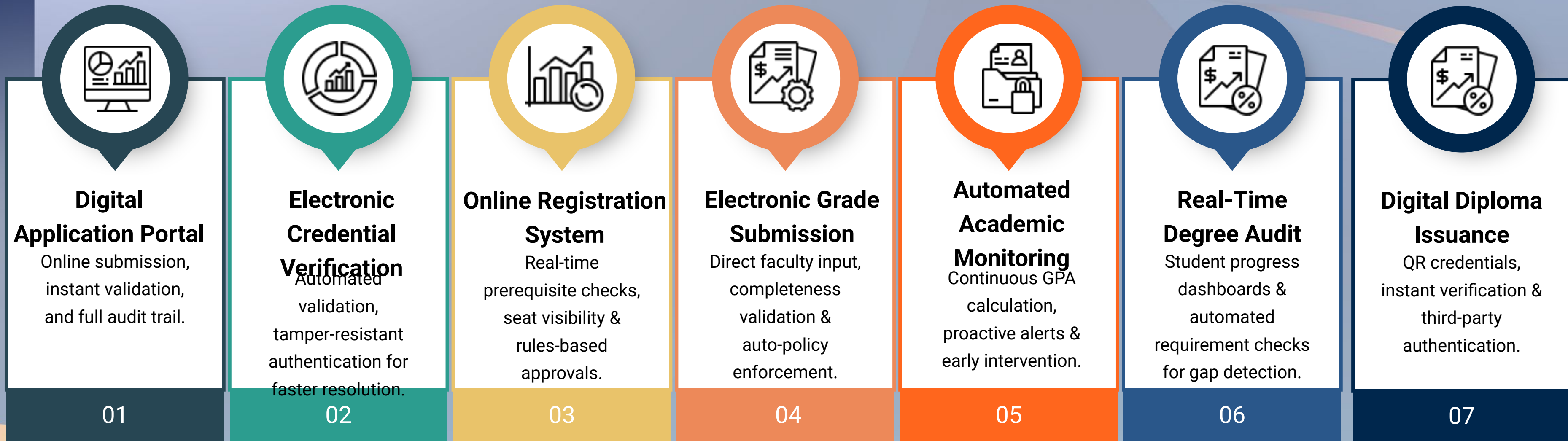
STUDENT LIFE CYCLE: Current and Future State

Understanding Our Integrity Landscape

Enrollment & admission records

(e.g., K-12 completion, eligibility)

Grades & academic standing

(e.g., grade tampering, academic load issues)

Credentials & graduation

(e.g., diploma issuance, honors verification)

TOR processing & authentication

(e.g., Transcript of Records for local/international use)

Shifting/Transfer records

(e.g., evaluation of transferred units, residency rules)

Board exam documentation & verification

(e.g., CHED endorsements, PRC requirements)

-  Every exception is documented



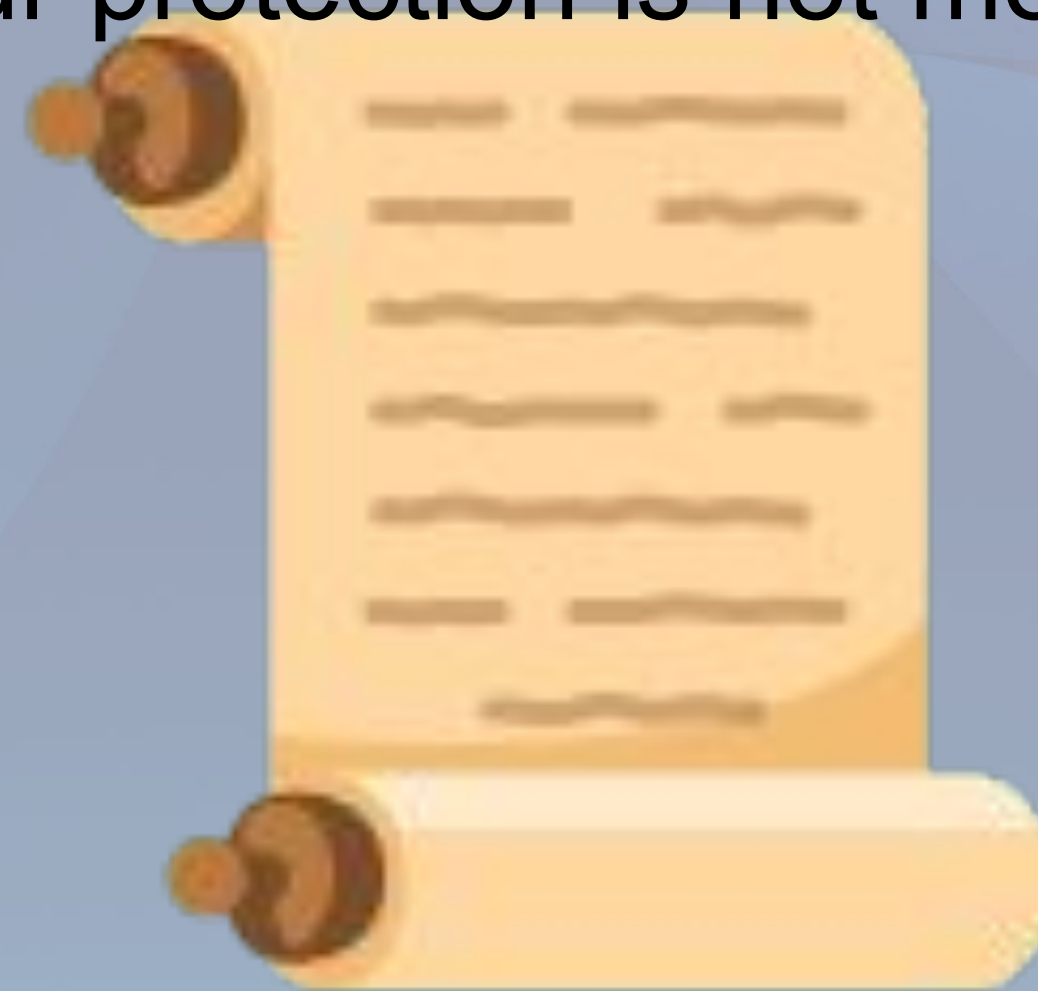

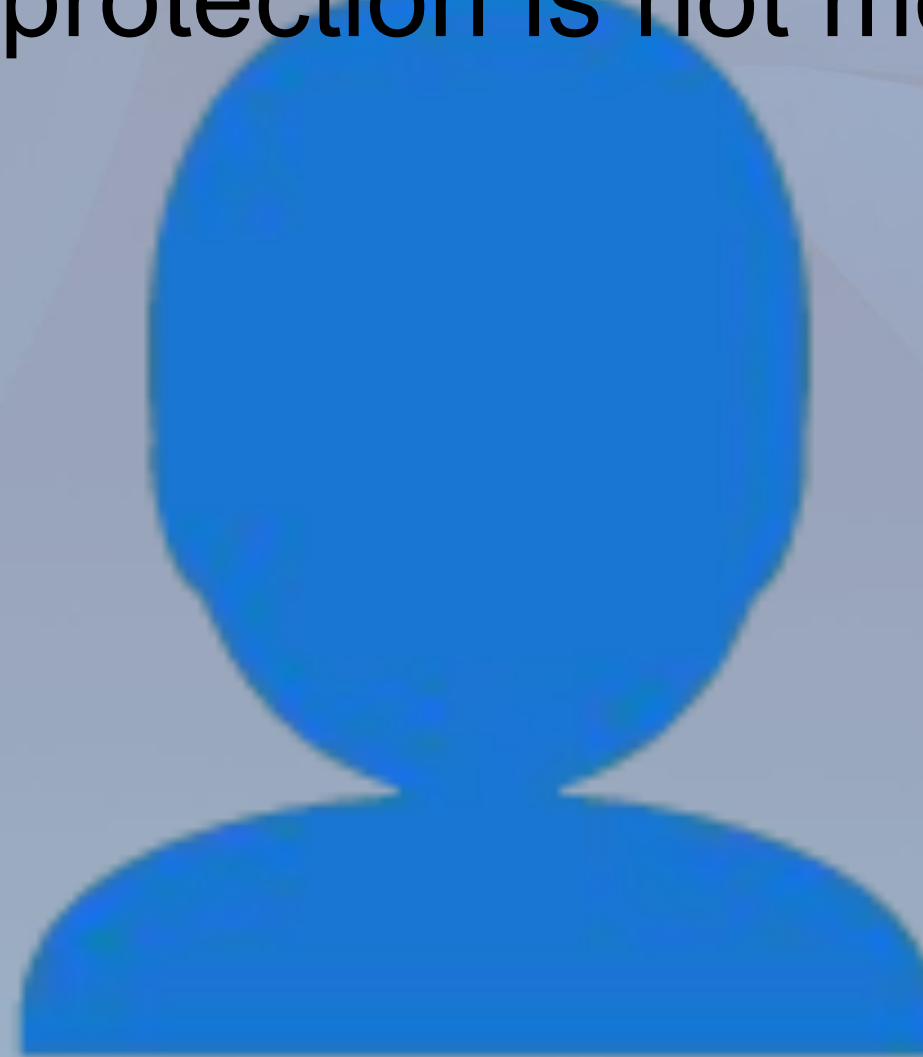

Audit

Risk
The possibility that records contain errors, omissions, or misstatements that may lead to:

- Incorrect reporting
- Compliance findings
- Financial / academic discrepancies

Even when no wrongdoing is intended.

→ Problem of controls / systems /

processes

Integrity

Risk
The possibility that policies, ethical standards, or rules are violated, causing:

- Loss of trust
- Credibility damage
- Compliance breaches
- Reputational harm

→ Problem of ethics / behavior /

governance

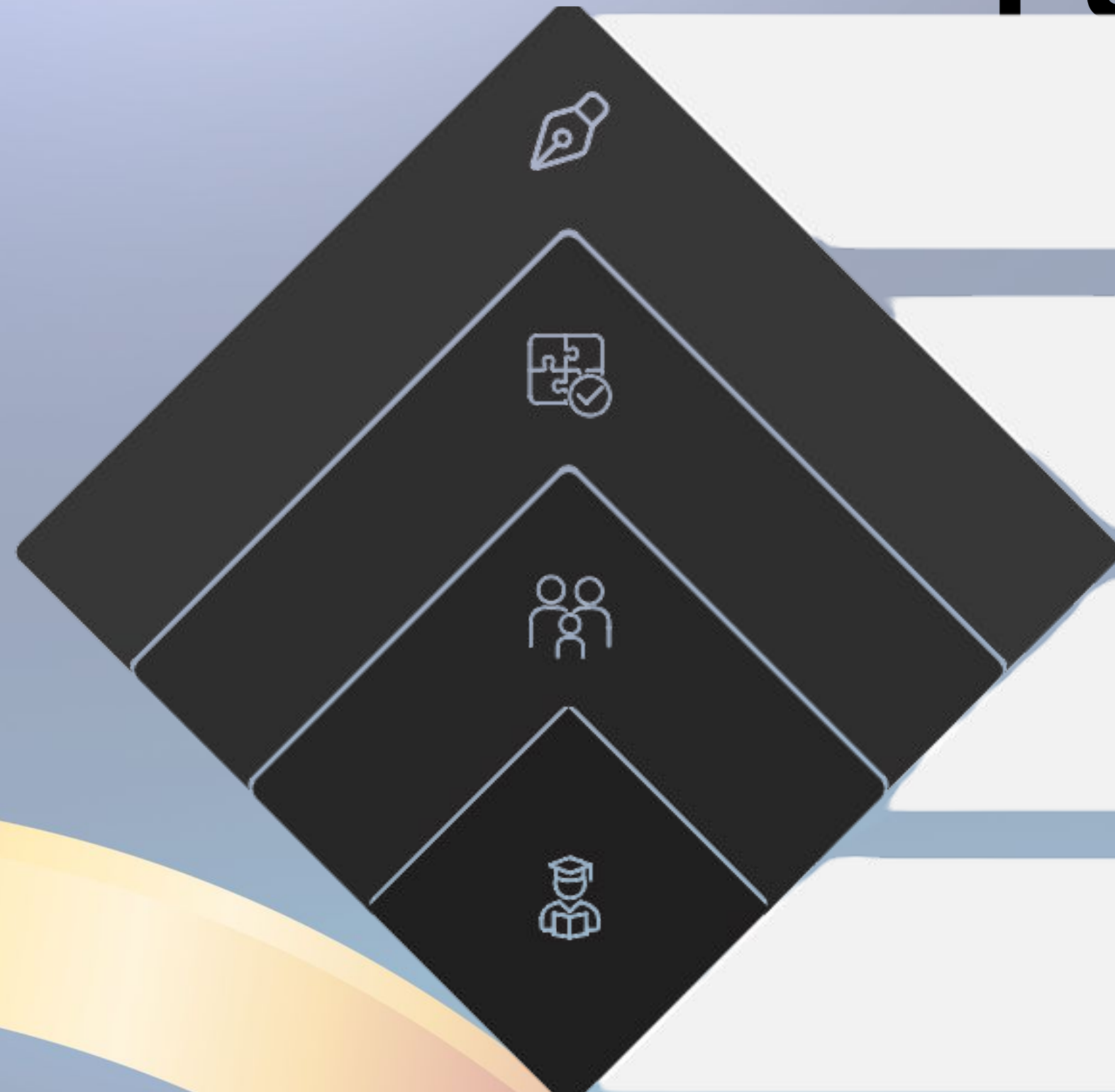

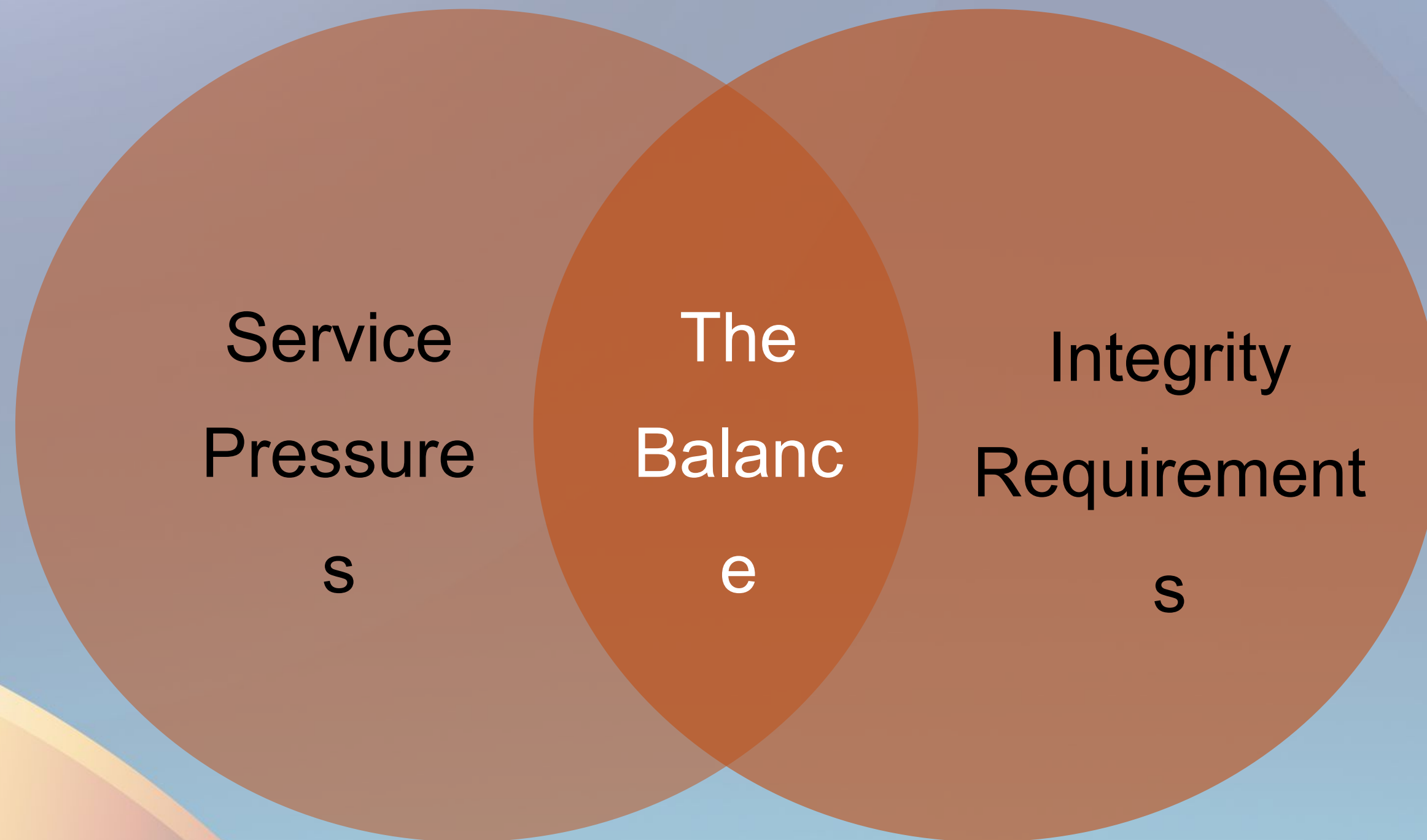

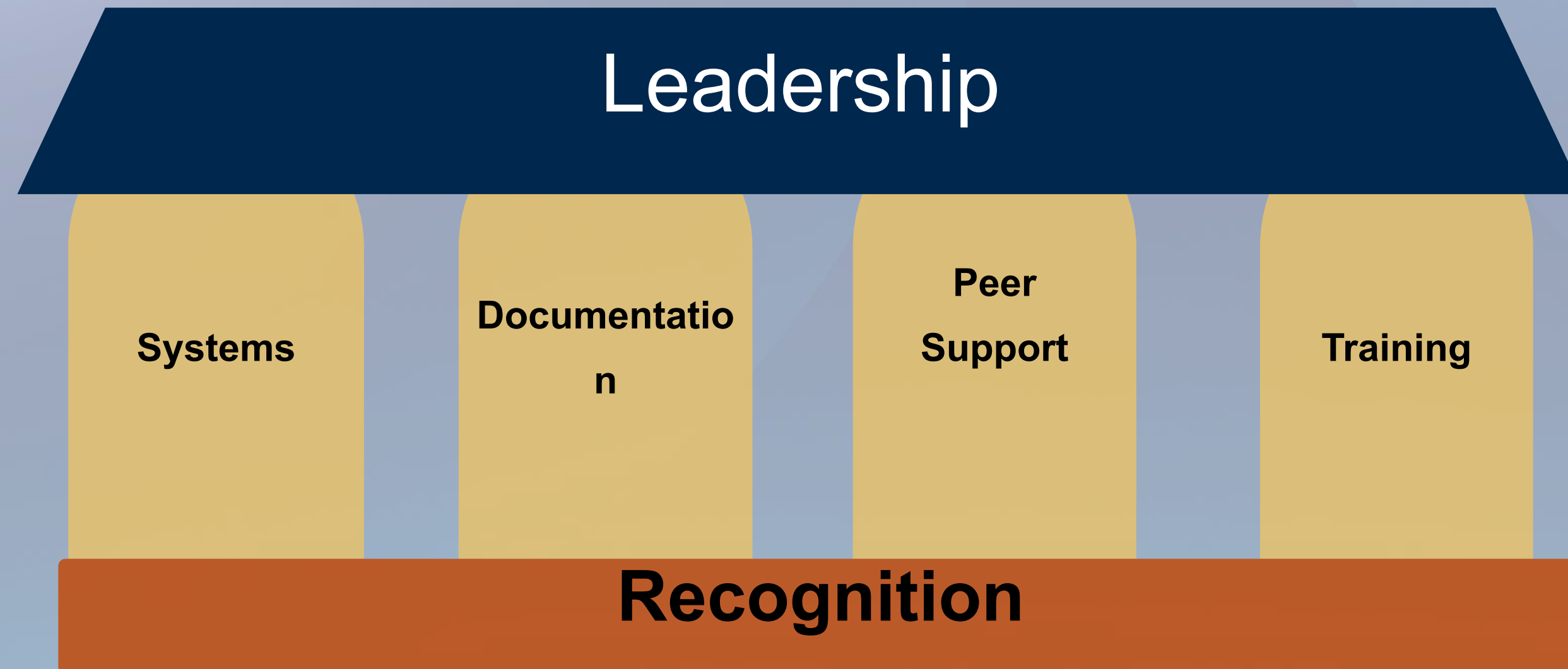
